We invite you to participate in this effort by using the suggestions and resources on the KYN webpage for individual, community, and youth actions.



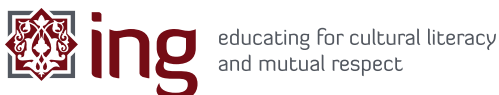
### What you can do within your community...
